Lawn crypts provide the benefits of mausoleum entombment

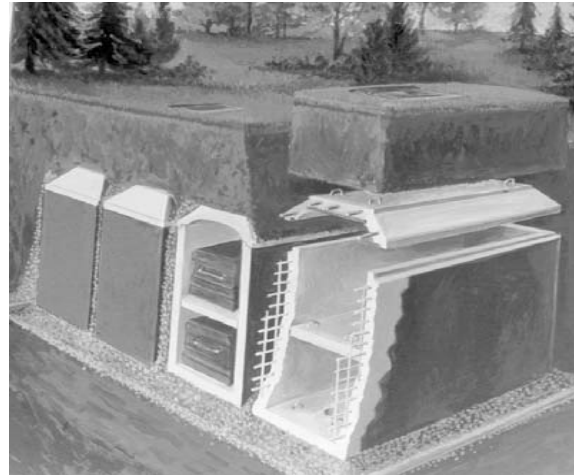
Referred to as an inground mausoleum, lawn crypts are constructed of steel reinforced concrete encased in a protective gravel shell providing enduring strength and lasting protection.

Lawn crypts are installed in multiple sections rather than individual units. This provides a tremendous savings in construction, labor and materials, and we pass these savings on to you.



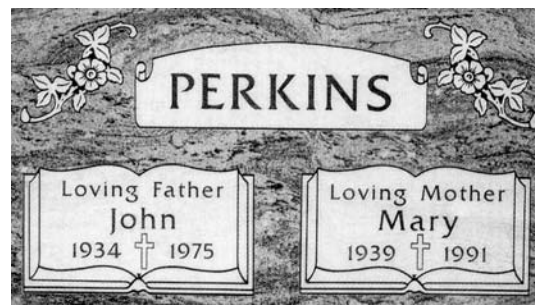

Memorials pay tribute to a life and identify the lawn crypt space. They are usually constructed of bronze or granite.

Interment services

Interment services includes the following: administration, permanent record keeping and documentation, opening and closing of the lawn crypt, interment set up and maintenance of the burial site.
